#### Description

"Obsidan +003" radiates the deep, cosmic stillness of a celestial artifact, as if excavated from the void between stars. The black, textured expanse glimmers with mica-like constellations, while the domed resin orb at the center resembles either a preserved droplet of time or a magnified singularity. Gold flakes drift through the darkness like remnants of stardust or shattered myth. The palette—dominated by midnight black, interstellar purples, electric blues, and teal iridescence—anchors the work in a metaphysical realm. There's a clear visual and thematic connection to Obsidian +004, with both capturing the liminal space between creation and destruction, motion and stillness.

### Description

"Obsdiain +004" feels like a fragment of a primordial terrain, suspended in deep time. There's a profound stillness here, almost archaeological. The blackened surface, studded with mica-like particles, raw stones, and hints of metallic shimmer, evokes the crust of an alien world or a microscopic topography of a life-bearing asteroid. Its glittering greens and golds shimmer beneath a skin of black, recalling bioluminescence, mineral veins, or dark matter blooming into form. This one speaks in geological time, yet pulses with something strangely alive—as if a dormant intelligence lies just beneath the surface.

### Description

"Vortext +012" feels like a cosmic or interdimensional rift captured mid-bloom. There's an explosive energy in the swirling composition, where cool celestial blues collide with fiery ambers and smoldering violets. The dense texture and granular glints create the illusion of both nebula and mineral, like stardust suspended in resin. The interplay of light and motion gives it an otherworldly quality—almost like a satellite image of a forming galaxy or a mythic storm viewed from above. It evokes awe, turbulence, and transformation.

### Description

"Malachis Magma +003" reveals an incredibly rich, tactile surface—glimmering textures interspersed with dark, almost volcanic formations. The embedded butterflies and scorpion anchor the composition with a visceral symbolism: life, fragility, and danger entangled within a geological dreamscape. Mikal's peice doesn't just suggest metamorphosis, it contains it. The scorpion and butterflies are not only sculptural; they feel like archaeological discoveries within the terrain, preserved by molten time. The metallic and earthen palette deepens this illusion of both heat and fossilization.

### Description

"Compass to Canaan +002" is a breathtaking shift in tone and atmosphere. It's cool, ethereal, yet still rooted in a sense of elemental rawness. The interplay of silvery blues, pale golds, and mottled texture gives it the look of weathered metal or a frozen celestial body, touched by erosion or time. There's a quiet radiance at the center, like a distant star diffused through a frost-covered lens, while the lower portion—marked by a wound-like fissure—grounds the composition with something earthly, almost sacred.

# Description

"Vortex +014" invites the viewer into an abstract, cosmic dreamscape where emotion and texture entwine. These marbled tendrils suggest a ghostly human form, as though a face is emerging—or dissolving—into mist. The ethereal quality of the composition evokes feelings of memory, transience, and subconscious revelation. Light dances delicately on the textured surface, hinting at both creation and decay. This painting balances on the edge between form and abstraction, allowing viewers to interpret its meaning through their own emotional lens.

## Description

"Vortext +013" is a verdant meditation on life's quiet resilience. A deep, organic green spreads across the canvas like moss over stone, interrupted by bursts of white and pale light, evoking spores, stars, or seeds mid-flight. The layered textures feel subterranean and cosmic at once—inviting the viewer to fall inward, into the slow pulse of nature. The central movement suggests a quiet eruption, like life insisting on itself. Scattered organic matter embedded within the surface blurs the line between representation and abstraction, between forest floor and galactic nebula. It's a place where decay becomes creation, and stillness hums with unseen energy. In this piece, the earth breathes. And in that breath, we feel both small and sacred.

#### Description

## Description
